

# Winemaker's Notes

VARIETY:	<b>Sangiovese</b>
VINTAGE:	2019
APPELLATION:	Texas High Plains Farmhouse Vineyard
ALCOHOL:	13.8%
OAKING:	8 months in neutral French Oak



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The purpose of this release is to focus on a wine's "sense of place", which is known in the wine industry as the concept of **terroir**. This concept can be defined as the encompassing environment, including soil, climate, topography, and farming practices which are key components in determining the final taste of the wine. The three wines presented are 100% Sangiovese, all grown within the Texas High Plains AVA. Winemaking was identical for all three wines in order to demonstrate the profound effects of **terroir**.

Known for having the "best damn client list in Texas", the "vignerons" at Farmhouse Vineyards are winegrowers first, but recently have had the unique opportunity to bring small lots of boutique wines to consumers when the vintage sees fit. From its own rooted Sangiovese, grown on the complex soils of the "Whitehouse Parker" site, this wine pours light garnet red in the glass, with bright herbal infused red berry aromatics that transitions to cranberry orange-sherbet cream (dreamsicle?) flavors on the palate.
